Return to School Criteria

KEY INDICATOR

COVID-19 CASES ACROSS THE PARISH
SHOW A 10-14 DAY DECLINE.



*All schools will offer virtual learning throughout the 2020-2021 school year for any child in need of or desiring remote instruction.

The East Baton Rouge Parish School System is eager to have students back on campus. The school system created a Health Advisory Committee, in partnership with Our Lady of the Lake and the Louisiana Department of Health, to support a safe, timely return to in-person learning. The school system will prioritize the return of its youngest students to a hybrid model first. **In order for this to occur, East Baton Rouge Parish must see a decline in cases over a 10 to 14 day period.**

- After any successive 10 to 14 day period of stable or declining cases, the superintendent will consult with the Health Advisory Committee to determine the cadence for bringing other grade bands back and to determine when traditional in-person learning is safe.
- The transition to and future continuation of in-person learning will also be contingent upon a variety of factors that may include the following: the number of cases; local hospital capacity; availability of PPE's and cleaning supplies; safety materials; adequate staffing for school and transportation functions.
- Should cases begin rising, the district will work with the Health Advisory Committee to determine the need for any adjustments back to virtual learning.

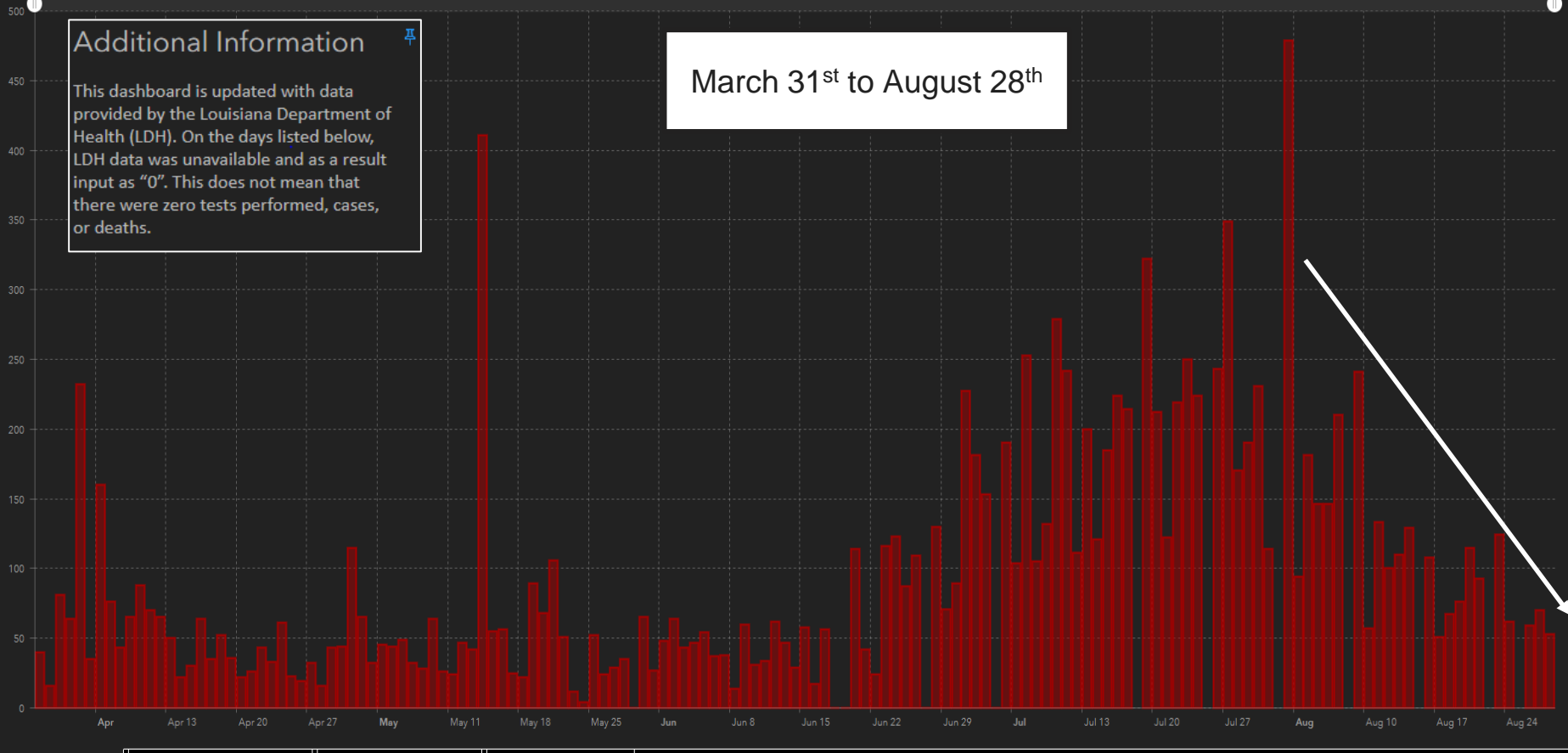
EBRPSS will continue to monitor the public health crisis; adhere to national, state and local guidance; and make adjustments to this approach as needed. Through every step, EBRPSS will provide frequent and clear communications with families. Data for transitions will be reviewed frequently. An update will be provided no later than September 1st.
