


EBR Readiness Middle School

Orientation Procedures



- 1. Parent and student sign-in with the Clerk in the front office and the Clerk notifies the Facilitator of their arrival.
- 2. Clerk escorts parent and student to the Cafeteria.
- 3. Facilitator receives the parent and student in the Cafeteria.
- 4. Counselor issues registration documents to complete prior to the start of the presentation.
- 5. Facilitator identifies which Cohort the student will be assigned as parents complete registration documents to allow Counselor to create schedule.
- 6. Counselor collects registration documents as completed and verifies all documents have been completed.
- 7. Counselor rolls student over from homeschool to EBR Readiness Middle in JCampus
- 8. Once rolled over, Counselor gives registration folder(s) to the Clerk to verify registration form.
- Clerk verifies address on registration form match address in JCampus (If not, 2 proofs of residency are required) and updates emergency contact information.
- 10. Secretary receives \$45.00 supply fee.
- 11. Clerk request bus for student and communicates information with parent once received.





THINGS YOU MUST HAVE FOR

ORIENTATION/REGISTRATION



- The following are required:
- Orientation is required for all students and parents before a student is allowed to attend.
- Registration all paperwork must be completed before leaving campus.
- \$45.00 Non-Refundable Supply Fee Payable by cash or Money Order only (includes Technology fee, Id card & school supplies)
- Hearing Decision Documents
- Drop slip with current grades and schedule (Previous school should deactivate student from their roster in JCampus once drop slip is issued)
- 504 Plan, IEP documentation and current Behavioral Plan (if applicable)
- Must have Proof of Parent or Legal Guardianship to register their student.
- All parents and students MUST attend Orientation before students will be allowed to attend school at EBR Readiness Middle School.



★ School Responsibilities

- 1. Create a welcoming, safe and positive environment for students and parents
- 2. Provide high-quality instruction in a supportive and effective learning environment
- 3. Provide support programs to address students' needs to ensure success

★ Parent Responsibilities

- 1. Make sure my child is on time and strives for 100 percent attendance, uniform compliance, and notifying the school if my child is absent
- 2. Check my child's school work, and call the school as needed to check on my child's progress
- 3. Support the school's <u>strict structure</u> to change my child's inappropriate behavior to transition back to his/her regular school setting

★ Student Responsibilities

- 1. Be on time for school each day dressed in the appropriate uniform, with hair in compliance with school policy
- 2. Come to school each day ready to learn and do my best work and ask for help when I need it. Attend interventions and complete all online/onsite assignments
- 3. Exhibit respect for all adults at my school and my classmates. I will not keep my classmates from learning in my classes or teacher from teaching







SOCIAL EMOTIONAL LEARNING (SEL) SKILLS



Social-emotional learning is understanding and managing emotions, setting and achieving positive goals, showing empathy for others, establishing and maintaining positive relationships, and making responsible decisions









What does Josing mean?

SCHOOL UNIFORM













PARENTS WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ENSURING THEIR STUDENT IS IN ACCORDANCE WITH SCHOOL DRESS CODE EACH DAY.

All students must wear school issued I.D. If your school ID is lost, must pay \$5.00 for a lost I.D. within 24 hours. If a student forgets an I.D. they must pay \$1.00 for a rental I.D.





ACCEPTABLE BEHAVIOR: NON-NEGOTIABLE DRESS CODE FOR EBR READINESS MIDDLE SCHOOL

School Uniforms

- ■Students must have on district appropriate Polo at all times
- ■Students must have shirts tucked inside of khaki's at all times/Pants cannot be tucked in socks
- ■Students must have a solid navy sweatshirt, royal blue sweatshirt or a sweatshirt from his/her home school.
- ■JACKETS, OVERCOATS, AND ANY ITEM WITH A HOOD ARE NOT ALLOWED ON CAMPUS

○Girl's Hair

- ■We reserve the right to preclude students wearing faddish or outlandish hair colors. (Purple, Blue, Green) etc...
- ■Only white or black headbands will be allowed.
- ■NO hair accessories/ No artificial eye lashes
- ■Hair must be groomed neatly daily

○Boy's Hair

- We reserve the right to preclude students wearing faddish or outlandish hair colors. (Purple, Blue, Green) etc...
- ■NO hair accessories
- ■Hair must be neatly groomed daily.

JEWELRY

ONo Jewelry of any kind: no watches, no necklaces, no earrings, no nose rings, no bracelets are to be worn to school

• OTHER - Prohibited items:

- No large buckles or designer belts
- No fingernail polish
- No acrylic nails
- ONo combs, picks, or brushes.
- ONo more than \$5 cash (for concessions only)
- No food, gum or candy brought to school
- No medicine, OTC or prescribed brought to school without proper documentation submitted by parent/guardian to the front office
- No phones or other electronic equipment are allowed at the school







PROHIBITED ITEMS

PROHIBITED ITEMS WILL NOT BE GIVEN BACK TO STUDENT.

Rule of Thumb:

"IF YOU WANT TO KEEP IT, DON'T BRING IT TO SCHOOL!"

NO WEAPONS OF ANY TYPE SHOULD BE BROUGHT ONTO THE CAMPUS,

possession of weapons or anything that can be used to cause harm to others will be cause for dismissal from the school.





ELECTRONIC DEVICE CONFISCATION PROTOCOL

Electronics

- No cell phones, beepers, and other electronic devices used to talk and/or record conversations will be allowed at school.
- ■The EBRPSS Board Policy states: No person, unless authorized by the school principal or designee, shall use, possess, or operate any electronic telecommunication device including any facsimile system, radio paging service, mobile telephone service, intercom, or electro-mechanical paging system in any elementary or secondary school building, or on the grounds thereof or in any school bus.
- The prohibited item (s) shall be given to the principal and assistant principal, Mr. Clark and Ms. Hebert, respectively. They will not be given back to the student or the guardian/parent. Please speak with your child about leaving all prohibited items at home. Refusal to surrender the prohibited item (s) will result in your child being suspended from school.

S.L.A.B STRATEGIC LEARNING ALTERNATIVES TO BEHAVIOR

*Failure to follow behavior expectations

Will yield to the following:

As a therapeutic intervention effort to change mindsets and behavior, garner support and adherence to school protocols, students will be assigned to the Re-Engagement Facilitator when their behavior or willingness to cooperate with teaching staff is problematic, to undergo physical fitness training activities and restorative practices designed to redirect inappropriate behavior and gain their better cooperation with staff.



Refusal to follow directions the first time, and participate in physical fitness training or follow the directions of adult staff in the building will lead to the parent conference the following day. Students that do not have a parent return with them will be suspended.

Parents will be notified immediately upon student's refusal to cooperate in physical training intervention, and asked to come and get their child within two (2) hours of call.








AUTOMATIC SUSPENSION

- FIGHTING / INCITING A FIGHT / BULLYING
- DRUGS AND PARAPHERNALIA
- POSSESSION OF WEAPONS
- PROHIBITED TOBACCO ITEMS / LIGHTERS
- SEXUAL HARASSMENT OR INAPPROPRIATE TOUCHING





*These violations will lead to Suspension.



AUTOMATIC SUSPENSIONS CONTINUED...

*Parents must return to school with their student after each suspension for a conference with the assistant principal or his designee. The student will no be permitted on campus without a conference with his/her parent.

Bus Transportation

ALL RULES FOR THE SCHOOL APPLY FOR BUS TRANSPORTATION. IF STUDENTS FAIL TO COMPLY WITH BUS RULES IT WILL LEAD TO A 10 DAY SUSPENSION OF BUS PRIVILEGES THE FIRST TIME.

When students are suspended from the bus, parents must provide transportation, failure to pick-up your child by 3:00 p.m., will prompt a call to Department of Children and Family Services.







TIER IV







Tier IV

Tier IV offers a non-traditional setting and support for students who continue to experience behavior challenges in the re-engagement schools. This alternative offers opportunities for students to continue to engaging with academic coursework aligned to the Louisiana Student Standards and receive targeted support from the school counselor or social worker to support transition back into the school setting.







NON-VIOLENT CRISIS INTERVENTION (NCI) AND PHYSICAL REMOVAL OF STUDENTS

- NCI will be used as a last resort necessary when students refuse to follow verbal directions given by staff and administration. The staff has been trained in these procedures, and will use them when necessary.
- NCI will be used to prevent students from hurting themselves, Faculty and Staff, or other students.
- NCI Intervention will never be performed by one adult. Three (3) or more adults will always remove or relocate students.
- Parents will be notified immediately and expected to pick up students within 2 hours of notification.





TRANSPORTATION CONCERNS

The school submits an initial request for bus transportation once your child is enrolled based on the current address in JCampus or per an official change of address with supporting documentation (minimum 2 proofs of address)

ATTENDANCE PROCEDURES

Your child's attendance is important. Middle school students attend a minimum of 167 days a school year.

Everyday a student is not enrolled is counted as an unexcused absence.

 Absences are only excused in limited circumstances. Documentation needs to be sent within three days of your child's return to school, if it is an excused absence.

Tardiness/Check-Ins

- Our school day is from 7:00 am until 2:25 pm
- No students are allowed on campus before 7:00 am (NO EXCEPTIONS)
- Students must remain in the vehicle with their parent or guardian prior to 7:00 am
- Students cannot be left unsupervised
- 7:30 am is a tardy and MUST BE CHECKED IN BY A PARENT/GUARDIAN

Check-outs

- NO STUDENT MAY CHECK OUT AFTER 1:45 PM
- Only the names on a student's **Emergency Card** will be allowed to check out a student

The Child Welfare and Attendance Office will contact parents when students miss five (5) days or more, and <u>actions</u> will be taken if students are not attending <u>regularly</u>.








IN SUMMARY...
