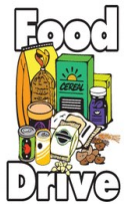

Manners of the Heart — APPRECIATING OTHERS

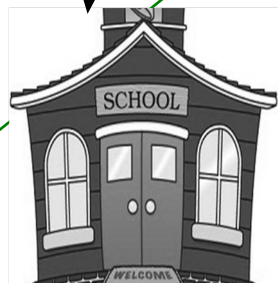
