Each SEAC Meeting listed above documents in the minutes that a quorum was met. Participation was encouraged through sending messages to parents via the district's JCampus System.

### **Executive Summary**

This section of the SEAC Annual Report will detail the activities undertaken by the Council for the 2023-2024 school year inclusive of additional informal SEAC Planning Meetings. This discussion will demonstrate the district's SEAC intent to organize and develop programs for the inclusion of students with disabilities and proposed recommendations to the Superintendent.

# Overview of Special Education in the East Baton Rouge Parish School System (EBRPSS)

Subgroup data relative to students with disabilities in the EBRPSS for the 2022-2023 school year revealed that these students' academic performance showed a 5.2% increase. The district attributes this increase to the "push" by the Department of Exceptional Student Services (ESS) for the use of more inclusive practices in curriculum and instruction. The LEA Determinations for the 2022-2023 school year revealed a decrease in the Interests and Opportunities Index for high school students. ### Highlights and Accomplishments of the Council

The district's SEAC coordinated a series of informal planning meetings consisting of Council members where discussions relative to recommended programs and agendas were held. These planning meetings resulted in the following recommended actions:

Secondary Transition Discussion Panel of Experts – Panel was provided virtually
for parents of students with disabilities on or around March 2023 where
information was received from district personnel and community stakeholders
on planning for students' post school outcomes.

- Summer Camps for Students with Disabilities Recommendation by SEAC for students with disabilities to have camps inclusive of physical activities where they can participate.
- Spring Dance for Students with Disabilities
- Summer Enrichment Camps for Students with Disabilities Academic and physical activities are to be provided to middle school students on or around June 2024 to enhance skills.

### Areas of Improvement/Next Steps/Timeline of Upcoming Activities

Areas of improvement are noted in the Council identifying expanded areas of services and activities that can be provided to enrich and/or remediate academic, communication, motor areas for students with disabilities. Next steps would entail that the Council conduct a "deep dive" into the academic data of students with disabilities and develop a comprehensive set of recommendations. Upcoming activities will focus on mental health activities and advocating for accessible and cost-effective programs for students with disabilities.

### Parent Engagement

The district provides Parent University for all parents of students within the East Baton Rouge Parish School System (EBRPSS). The district implemented a Superintendent's Parent Advisor Council which met monthly at the Central Office and provided a forum for parents to express their concerns. The Exceptional Student Services Department seeks to involve parents of students with disabilities through participation in district-sponsored and community events where Child Search efforts are paramount.
