Mission: The mission of Baton Rouge Magnet High School is to provide a college preparatory curriculum that will enable students to be lifelong learners, critical thinkers, and ethical citizens who can function in an increasingly technical, diverse and global environment.

Established in 1880, Baton Rouge High School boasts a historic and picturesque campus, with its main neo-Gothic building, constructed in 1926 and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. A significant milestone is approaching, as this iconic building will celebrate its 100th anniversary throughout the year 2026-2027 with the official date is September 19, 2027. This centennial event will mark the first day that students walked through the halls on Government Street.

Baton Rouge Magnet High School was created in 1976 with a mission to elevate standards and cultivate artistry, providing a distinct educational narrative. Its academic core is a solid college preparatory program, motivating students with 56 advanced and honors courses. Here, a culture of character is built through 100 clubs and organizations. This environment consistently produces a legacy of excellence, as students each year are recognized as National Merit scholars, Presidential Scholar Candidates, and part of an elite group of over 500 Advanced Placement Scholars.

Academics & Curriculum

Four-Year Requirement: All students must take a full course load for all four years; early graduation is not an option.

Senior Opportunities: The seniors are required to take 8 classes and may not leave early unless they take early college classes.

9th/10th Grade Programs: All freshmen and sophomores are required to participate in the Accelerated Reader Program and take Pre-Advanced Placement (Pre-AP) courses in English I and II.

School Culture & Student Life

Behavioral Framework: The school operates on a school-wide PBIS model: "Be Respectful, Be Responsible, and Be Safe."

Student Governance: An active student council meets with the administration and sponsors to represent and address student concerns.

Student Clubs and Organizations: Students initiate, create, lead, and manage 100 clubs that create a rich campus environment.

Students and Sports

Athletics: Boys and girls can excel in teams for track, cross country, swimming, soccer, gymnastics, wrestling, powerlifting, golf, bowling, tennis, and volleyball.

Technology & Communication

School App: The primary communication tool is the **BRMHS School APP**, which is free through the main "EBR APP."

Classroom Integration: Teachers at all levels integrate technology into their classrooms to promote effective communication, collaboration, and learning.

1:1 Chromebook program: Every student is provided with a Chromebook to use for learning, both in the classroom and at home. This approach aims to integrate technology seamlessly into the curriculum and ensure equitable access to digital resources.
